We are starting a new season and there are a few changes in the float rules.

There is a new requirement that you have your boat be insured, properly registered, and that you show proof before your boat will be allowed in the marina. We are going to use a sticker for the boats that have paid and which have been checked for insurance and registration (see the form on page 8 of this newsletter). Those that are assigned floats should get the information to the club as soon as possible. This information will be checked before the boat is allowed in the marina. There has always been a requirement that a three-day notice be given to the float committee in order to bring a boat into the marina, so anyone that brings a boat in, whether they have a permanent slip or not, will be fined for unauthorized use of the slip. The float committee needs the cooperation of the members to make this work. Members that know they are putting a boat in should get this paper work in long before they give their three-day notice so they can receive their sticker.

The annual float give away will be April 11th and anyone in line for a float should bring this information along with a check to pay the float fee. The rules will be enforced so read your rule book.

Monthly Meeting
February 4, 2010**

The meeting was called to order at 6:45 p.m.

Guest: Ellen Berkland, archaeologist from the Environment Department of the city of Boston. Ellen has looked through the archives in the state and in the Environment department, and put together a thick packet of documentation on work done in the bay going back many years. The CSO (combined sewer overflow) and MWRA (Mass water resources authority) have done work. UMass did testing for their bathymetry project, some was done with Pete Rosen from Northeastern Univ., including soil samples outside the bridge. There has been interest in the bay, because of the working bridge. There should be historical records, including Coast Guard, the Commissioner's records which talk about coastal sites, including all the warves and piers in Boston Harbor. Our parcel should be represented from the earliest instances of building until present. She said that she should be able to get dredging records that could show past dredging, silt sources and distribution. Dave Greenwood said that if we can get the information about soil testing, we'd be able to skip that expense (currently estimated at 50-60 thousand dollars; but testing had been done because there had originally been a plan (Kevin Mooney) to dredge up to the highway. Dave noted that we are looking to get a quote from Boston Bridge and Towing (Jeff Lake). Ellen wondered why there hadn't been remediation from MWRA (given sewage overflow that had been going on for many years). She will contact Jack Sullivan at FEMA for more information and will get back to us. In the meantime, she gave us the information which Dave will get copies of to Jack Hannon who has been our lead person on the dredging project.

Correspondence: Bill Dolan's father passed away, flowers were sent to the wake and condolences offered. A request for funds for the Dorchester Youth Hockey

who are raising funds to send their team to the national championships in New York was received. The Board of Directors voted to donate \$500.00 to DYH.

Treasurer's Report: Paid Wally Pozark for 5 bubblers for floats; nearly weekly oil deliveries, Property taxes to City of Boston, three electric bills, reimbursements and stipends to officers per fee schedule/by-laws. New bills for Prestige (burgees, etc.) and for ductwork cleaning. We made \$1000 on ice last year, and \$11,000 on gasoline sales.

Torrey Brown and Robert Kilzelewicz who had been ejected have sent in dues. They will have to be voted back in at the March meeting.

House: Dave will look into getting a light on the flag pole for 24-hr display; a new flag will be put up.

Inboard: Al would like to put hoops on some of the new pilings (9) which were put in, but the hoops not installed. This would be about \$650-700; the end of A and C should be top-coated with weather preservative; we could also do the other end of C and B; that would be a few hundred dollars. There are 3 fingers (also 3 on the outboard side) that need to be condemned. Those cost is around \$1500.00, with costs divided into threes: the cost for each of the two members on a finger float is approximately \$500.00, with the club also paying \$500 toward the float cost: if a member doesn't help build the float, then the member is billed \$250.00. The members on the condemned floats will be sent registered letters.

Al has taken photos at very low tides in the past month, showing continued silt buildup in the marina. There were several spots with less than a foot of water. There were decreases in water depth of as much as 5 inches since he last took photos and readings one year ago.

Ray pointed out that our only real hope to get something done is to pay Jack Hannon something to begin serious investigation, and to get something into the legislature for next year, when so that when bills are written to be introduced in the second or third week of January 2011.

Al will investigate a new method to protect the docks for next year, using pvc pipe and a compressor blowing air which will circulate water to keep ice from forming, since the low water.

Outboard: Nothing new to report.

Old Business: Several board members visited Gene Sullivan yesterday to discuss the lawsuit. An offer to settle will be tendered; while we don't expect this to be accepted, it would make the Boyces liable to court fees should we prevail in the lawsuit.

Question about using a sticker system; members of the outboard and inboard float committees would be authorized to give members a sticker which would indicate that a member who brought a boat in had supplied registration, proof of insurance, and no money owed to the club. Al suggested that the best way is that a form be filled out with copies of insurance and registration that get sent in as soon as possible. Once Lee confirms no money is owed, a sticker is mailed out, and then three days before they come in they call Al or Bob to make sure their float. This should go in the February and March newsletter, and then kicked off at the float give-away. Make a note in the newsletter to new members that they shouldn't wait; that subleases aren't allowed to bring a boat in without the information. Ray suggested further that we should ask new members to submit a copy of registration and insurance certificate with their application. Include insurance limits. If a boat cannot comply with the insurance rule, the float chairman will see to the enforcement of the rule.

New Business:

Lee suggested we get a monthly report on the work that Jack Hannon is doing on the dredging project. It was suggested that it would still be important to have face-to-face meetings. Dave Greenwood said he would contact Jack and see what could be set up for a meeting in the future, noting that he is often traveling because of his work for FEMA.

Jack Donegan suggested we change the by-law. Jack will call the accountant to see if there is standard language used given we do have a CPA do our taxes.

Lee said there would be a fishing show in March at Stonehill College in Easton. He asked if we wanted to have a booth to sell memberships. A booth would be \$350.00 (March 6 and 7th). Dave Greenwood moved we give the money for the booth, Bryan Taylor seconded. Approved. Efforts will be made to contact members via email for photos to decorate the booth and to get members to sign up for manning the booth at the show.

The meeting was adjourned at 8:45 p.m.

PROPOSED RULE CHANGES

It has become a problem that the rule for Mutual Exchanges on the floats is circumventing our seniority system. It is the Boards recommendation that this rule be changed so that the senior members have a shot at any open float according to their seniority. The Board of Directors suggests that Mutual Swaps can only be seasonal and transfers be handling a little differently. This will insure that senior members will have an opportunity at any float that becomes available though any circumstance such as a member giving up float or a death of a member. This seems fairer to our long time members and will insure our seniority system.

Rule Reads

MUTUAL EXCHANGE

A member who has been assigned a float and wishes to mutually exchange floats with another assignee must make a request in writing to the Float Committee, signed by both members, with a copy sent to the Secretary for filing in the members' records. The float Committee will decide if such request can be granted or denied after all facts are taken into consideration, and shall notify the Secretary of their decision and, if applicable, the reason for NOT granting such request.

Should Read

MUTUAL EXCHANGE

A member who has been assigned a float and wishes to mutually exchange floats with another assignee for the season must make a request in writing to the Float Committee, signed by both members, with a copy sent to the Secretary for filing in the members' records. The float Committee will decide if such request can be granted or denied after all facts are taken into consideration, and shall notify the Secretary of their decision and, if applicable, the reason for NOT granting such request.

Rule Reads

TRANSFER

When a slip (or slips) becomes available, the Inboard Float Chairman shall notify the Secretary to advise the members of the day and time the assignment will be made – FOR INCLUSION IN THE NEXT MEETING NOTICE. A sufficient number of names from the top of the list will also be printed, and the members MUST attend if they wish an assignment. Assigned Inboard Float members desiring to TRANSFER to a new location shall also attend. Transfers will be made first strictly on a seniority basis in the Club, taking into consideration, however, the size of the member's boat. In cases where 2 or more members are assigned a float, said members may be transferred either together or separately at their written request.

TRANSFER

When a slip (or slips) becomes available, the Inboard Float Chairman shall notify the Secretary to advise the members of the day and time the assignment will be made – FOR INCLUSION IN THE MEETING NOTICE BEFORE THE FLOAT GIVE AWAY. A sufficient number of names from the top of the list will also be printed, and the members MUST attend if they wish an assignment. Assigned Inboard Float members desiring to TRANSFER to a new location shall also attend. Transfers will be made first strictly on a seniority basis in the Club, taking into consideration, however, the size of the member's boat. In cases where 2 or more members are assigned a float, said members will be transferred together or if separately the member that was added to the slip will have to use his or her seniority to transfer to a new float.

New State Law to License Recreational Fishermen - Register federally in 2010, but purchase state permit in 2011

Beginning on January 1, 2010, any Massachusetts resident 16 years of age and older who fishes from shore or boat (not including charter or party boats) must have a federal fishing registration. This registration (i.e., license) is free for 2010. Beginning in 2011, fishermen will have to have a State salt-water fishing license, which is expected to cost \$10.00.

MarineFisheries will work during the next year to develop the state's permitting program and will provide public updates via its website, www.mass.gov/marinefisheries. Meanwhile, *MarineFisheries* will be working with NMFS to assist anglers with federal registration during 2010. Massachusetts anglers who fish in federal waters, or target or catch anadromous species (saltwater fish that spawn in freshwater) like shad, striped bass or smelt in any tidal or salt waters must register beginning January 1, 2010.

Some anglers are exempt from registration in 2010: those under 16; patrons on permitted charter, party or guide boats; anglers who hold a Migratory Species Angling permit; anglers fishing commercially under a valid commercial permit; or are already registered in an exempted state. Federal registration is free in 2010 and starting January 1, 2010, you can register by calling 888.MRIP.411 (888.674.7411) or online at www.countmyfish.noaa.gov.

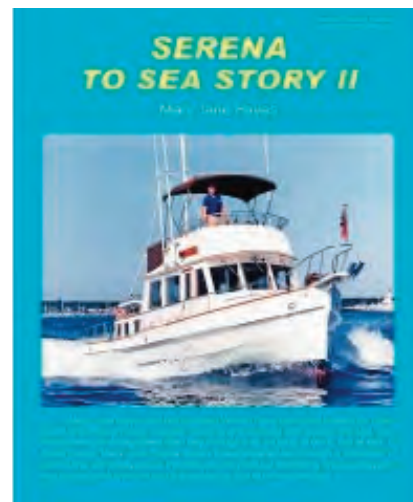
