April 11th is the annual float give away. Members looking to transfer or get a new assignment need to attend the meeting. New assignments need to pay for the slip they are assigned. We made a few changes to the Float Rules to help protect our seniority system and voted for them this month. Last year the list covered a lot of names and people should check the list because once they are passed over they need to request to be put back on the bottom of the list in writing.

Members putting in boats need to notify the chairmen of the float committees three days in advance of bringing their boat in, regardless whether they have a permanent slip or are a sub-lease. You also have to provide a valid copy of your registration and insurance policy and be a member in good standing (paid up including fines for missed watches) before you will be allowed to bring your boat into the marina.

The Regatta Committee is planning to run opening day similar to last year's event, with the Blessing of the Fleet the next day. Keep your eyes on the newsletter for more details on the dates and times of these events.

We would like to see a lot of participation from the membership in these events; it's what makes us a club not just a marina. It also makes for a better time you know the more the merrier. The officers and board members are still plugging away at the locker and dredging issues we have, and are making some progress, but we have a long way to go. We really need to start a dredging fund like other clubs have, or we'll need to buy kayaks.

We will not have as many work parties as before because the float system is almost complete but there is always some thing to do and it is the member's responsibility to find out what needs to be done and get their hours in for next year. Well as always the activity in the park and at the club is picking up with the good weather so please be careful coming and going from the club. Let's have another good season of sun and fun.

Monthly Meeting

March 4, 2010

Officers present: Paul Polito, Brian Taylor, Lee Perry, Steve Cavanaugh, Bill Rizzi

Directors present: Frank Antonelli, Ray Tomasini, Jack Donegan, Bob Mirabito

Chairmen present: Bob Bailey, David Greenwood, Al Chouinard

The meeting was called to order at 6:42 p.m.

Correspondence: Jack Hannon, sent an invoice \$3,230.00.

Treasurer's Report: Lee Perry reported that in January the club had receipts of \$12,796.69, and spent \$17,744.07 The main expenses were: property taxes, inboard float committee (~\$3000.00), salaries to club officers, and utility bills (>\$4000.00).

In February the club took in \$2,377.00 and spent \$3,578.00. The main expenses were for the House Committee and utility bills. In March so far we have spent \$10,000.00 for the DCR permit/lease.

Our accountant has been contacted about taxes, and as is customary, an extension has been filed.

Lee reports that we have seen a decrease in electric bills this year over last year. The balance in the regular checking account is ~\$128,000.00 and in the capital improvement fund there is \$100,000.00

House chairman submitted bill for \$1,750 for plowing, and an additional \$357 of expenses for parts and supplies.

House: The office upstairs has been painted, new outlets installed, new carpet, cleaned out and organized. Dave Greenwood would like to put up signs for the flag officers and committee chairmen for reserved parking. The Board OK'd this.

Inboard: Al reported that he has contacted Merko Marine, and they are getting an order out for the end of the week so we can complete the finger floats. He may have more lumber for the weekend following the membership meeting, to build finger floats for the inboard side.

Outboard: Bob reports that they had a work party to cut wood for 3 finger floats; he'll need 6 guys to bolt these together, and another 6 to pull the bubblers and change the zincs in them.

Permitting: All Set. We were considering purchasing a mooring for the use of any club member for the mooring field off of World's End. Brian went to see about a mooring permit in Hingham. Was told to see the Harbormaster, and

was told we were on a waiting list. It cost \$15.00 to apply, Ray Tomasini said he thought the cost for a mooring was \$250.00; Paul Polito said Jack Darling told him that the cost would be \$1000.00. [Ray Tomasini checked into this after the meeting and reported that "The application was taken on March 1st with a \$15 dollar application fee, the proposed amount set by the Harbormaster was \$350. The town selectmen got involved and want to charge \$2000 which the Harbormaster isn't comfortable with; he contends that he won't rent them at that rate. This issue is still open. As for who gets them, the boaters who had them last year and are in good standing have first shot. The rest of the approximately 15 moorings will be handed out on a first come, first served basis, going by when the application was made."]

Old Business: A member who had come before the Board for leaving heat on in the boat that is winter stored, contrary to the rules. The board decided on disciplinary action, and the member will be sent a letter by the Commodore.

Discussion turned to the need for metering boats in winter storage; David suggested that this was already covered in the winter storage rules.

For the summer, the suggestion was made that there be a fee per cord for boats that are constantly plugged in. Bob Mirabito suggested the same be done for winter storage, a fee per cord. No decision was reached at this meeting.

New Business: Ray will be meeting with Jack Hannon and Kevin Mooney of the DCR on Friday, March 5, 2010. Please see the end of these minutes for Ray Tomasini's report.

The following motion for a By-law change was made: That all Committee Chairmen (House, Inboard, Outboard, Regatta) and the 4 Directors have their dues reimbursed for the year they serve. In the case of Committee Chairman or Director who is a Life Member, they will be credited an amount equal to annual dues for the year he serves.

This will be put in the March newsletter to be voted on by the body in the April meeting.

The members who were granted extensions must pay by April 1st or they will be assessed with a \$50.00 fine.

We are spending too much on heat according to Dave. Dave has suggested we add zoned heating to the clubhouse, so we can have lower temperatures upstairs.

Frank Antonelli said we need meals from May on.

The meeting was adjourned at 8:04 p.m.

General Membership Meeting of the Dorchester Yacht Club

Paul Polito called the meeting to order at: 7:38 p.m.

Steve Cavanaugh read out the minutes for the January membership meeting, the BOD meeting on Feb 21st with Jack Hannon and the Board meeting of March 4th. Discussion began about the proposal to put up signs for reserved parking. The commodore tabled the discussion for the Unfinished Business portion of the meeting. The three sets of minutes were then accepted unanimously.

Treasurer's Report: January and February reports available. Highlights were read as part of BOD minutes from the March 4th meeting.

Correspondence: MBYCA notice was received.

House Committee: A question was raised about when electricity will be turned on, which Dave said would happen in the next few weeks. Paul Polito asked about the plumbing. Dave reported he feels that the plumbing to the lockers shouldn't be done until the lockers are jacked up and the work done underneath, so as not to have to redo the work.

Inboard Float Committee: Al stated that we will have a work party to build finger floats for the inboard floats. Priority will be for people whose fingers have been condemned, or they will have to pay. (The date for the work party is Saturday, March 20th); the hardware and lumber will all be here.

Outboard Float Committee: Bob Bailey reported that there will also be a work party to pull the bubblers this coming Saturday, March 13th.

Regatta: Jack Lewis reports that Opening Day will be June 19th (rain date will be June 26th), a cookout during the day, there will be a DJ with music during the day, and live music at night. The Blessing of the Fleet will be on Sunday, June 20th. He is also hoping to get together a softball team to play teams from other yacht clubs. This would happen in August. Frank Antonelli reports that the following monthly meeting meals are locked in:

Ray Shiner for April, Nancy Finn for May, Walter Hefferman for June

Permits: All set.

Safety: No report.

MBYCA: George Salah reported that the last meeting was at Braintree Yacht Club, which put on a very good meal following the meeting. The State Senate has passed a bill that would allow a yacht club on state property to have a 30-year lease. As the House has already passed this bill, and the governor has signed it, this is now the law. Paul Polito said this

is too new to see what effect it will have, as previous discussions indicated that each yacht club would now need to sit down with the DCR to discuss exact terms, likely with prices rising during the term of the lease. We are all set for this year, having just paid for the annual permit.

Unfinished Business: We have a few members to reinstate who have paid their back dues: John McGrail, Torrey Browne, Rob't Kizelewicz, Ben Kizelewicz. A motion was made to reinstate, which was approved unanimously.

The Parking Lot signs and reserved parking was then discussed. There was reserved parking before the parking lot was redone. It was noted that the reconfiguration of the parking lot caused us to lose approximately 50 spots, and at the time it was decided not to put signs up for reserved parking. While we cannot put up any signs from the fire hydrant north, we are able to do as we please with the lot directly in front of the clubhouse, which is part of the leased property. There was some feeling that given that many officers are compensated for service, that the reserved parking was not a good idea, given the limited parking we have.

Dave stated he feels that Flag Officers should have a parking spot reserved, as is commonly done at most yacht clubs. Al said that while he agrees that there should be some reserved spots, he also would not be happy to park at the end of the lot and walk past empty reserved spots. He suggested that only a smaller number of spots be reserved, for general use of BOD and Officers. Jack Donegan pointed out that the Parking Lot fell under the House Committee Chairman's authority, and that the rule about reserved parking had never been revoked.

Steve mentioned those rules state that the Commodore, Steward, Board of Directors and Chairmen of House, Inboard and Outboard Floats are the only ones mentioned as getting reserved spots (i.e., not the other flag officers).

New Business: The Mutual Exchange Rule Change was read out by the Commodore. After some discussion, during which Commodore Polito affirmed that there was not time limit imposed (e.g., this could be done as a seasonal swap for 5 years) this was voted on and passed.

The Transfer Rule Change was read out by the Commodore. Discussion centered on how this affects people with family members. Bob Mirabito spoke out on his being the perfect example of this, as he will have two sons on his slip with him. This rule change would mean that if he transfers, they kids transfers with him, and his slip would go to the person in the club with the most seniority. Motion was made to accept the rule change, it was accepted unanimously. Both of these rule changes should strengthen the concept of seniority being the determining factor in awarding privileges to members.

The meeting was adjourned at 8:30 p.m.

PROPOSED BY-LAW CHANGES

It has been proposed that all Committee Chairmen (House, Inboard, Outboard, Regatta) and the 4 Directors have their dues reimbursed for the year they serve. In the case of Committee Chairman or Director who is a Life Member, they will be credited an amount equal to annual dues for the year he serves. Specifically, this involves the following changes:

Article XI

Board of Directors
to be added

SECTION 7 The three Directors who are not officers of the club, along with the immediate Past Commodore who serves on the Board of Directions shall not pay dues during their term of office. If any of the Directors or the Past Commodore on the Board of Directors is a Life Member and is entitled to free membership, a sum equal to the current amount of dues shall be credited to that Director’s account toward the payment of float fees and/or locker rentals.

ARTICLE XII

House Committee
to be added

SECTION 8 The Chairman of the House Committee shall not pay dues during his term of office. If the House Committee Chairman is a Life Member and is entitled to free membership, a sum equal to the current amount of dues shall be credited to his account toward the payment of float fees and/or locker rentals.

ARTICLE XIII

Inboard Float Committee
to be added

SECTION 6 The Chairman of the Inboard Float Committee shall not pay dues during his term of office. If the Inboard Float Committee Chairman is a Life Member and is entitled to free membership, a sum equal to the current amount of dues shall be credited to his account toward the payment of float fees and/or locker rentals.

ARTICLE XIV

Outboard Float Committee
to be added

SECTION 6 The Chairman of the Outboard Float Committee shall not pay dues during his term of office. If the Outboard Float Committee Chairman is a Life Member and is entitled to free membership, a sum equal to the current amount of dues shall be credited to his account toward the payment of float fees and/or locker rentals.

ARTICLE XV

Regatta Committee
to be added

SECTION 4 The Chairman of the Regatta Committee shall not pay dues during his term of office. If the Regatta Committee Chairman is a Life Member and is entitled to free membership, a sum equal to the current amount of dues shall be credited to his account toward the payment of float fees and/or locker rentals.

PROPOSED BY-LAW CHANGE

That the first sentence of Section 4 of Article XI be changed. This now reads:

ARTICLE XI

Board of Directors

SECTION 4 It shall be the duty of the Board of Directors to have the books audited by a Certified Public Accountant ten (10) days prior to the Annual Meeting.

It is proposed the above sentence be deleted and the following put in its place, the rest of Article XI, Section 4 remaining unchanged.

There shall be no requirement for an annual audit of the Corporation’s books and financial records. The need for any audits, reviews or compilations of the Corporation’s annual financial statements shall be at the discretion of the Board of Directors or with a majority vote of the membership.

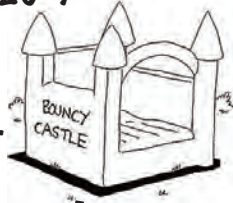

SENATE AUTHORIZES LONGER LEASE TERMS FOR YACHT CLUBS

Yacht clubs already operating on public lands could enter into 30-year leases with the state, longer than the current 5-year arrangements, under a House bill the Senate approved Thursday, March 4, 2010. The Senate voice-voted passage after an extended back-and-forth between Sen. Mark Montigny, who questioned why the state should cede more control of its land when access to the facilities is sometimes criticized, and Sen. Michael Morrissey, who said the clubs are often an affordable alternative for boat owners and need the ability to plan long-term capital investments. The House passed the bill in November.
